ENHANCING OUR COMMUNITIES, ONE SMILE AT A TIME: CORPORATE GIVING

For Eat'n Park Hospitality Group team members, hospitality extends far beyond the walls of our restaurants and client sites. In April 2017, 135 team members garnered their compassion, elbow grease and smiles and participated in our second annual Day of Smiles.

The day again focused on three core areas of support for nonprofit organizations:

- **Growing Smiles** — providing access to healthy food, as well as education about food choices, particularly for children;
- **Sharing Smiles** — supporting family wellness and fitness; and
- **Hero Smiles** — enhancing the lives of military veterans and their families.



The Growing Smiles teams volunteered their services in the following ways:

- At **Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank**, **Rainbow Kitchen Community Services** and the **Squirrel Hill Community Food Pantry** teams spent the day repacking food for families in need.
- In Braddock, the team worked with **Grow Pittsburgh** to help revitalize a green space, which will increase food security in this community.
- The team at **412 Food Rescue** assisted with efforts to prevent good food from entering the waste stream.
- Packing nutritious weekend snack packs for middle school students kept the team busy at **Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Pittsburgh**.



The Sharing Smiles teams focused on four nonprofit organizations:

- The team working with **FitUNITED** and **Project R.U.N.** helped underserved youth train for and run the Pittsburgh Marathon.
- At **Best of the Batch**, the team was busy refreshing the foundation's outdoor space.
- **Girls on the Run** holds an annual Spring 5K and the team here helped the organization prepare for race day.
- The team at **GTECH** helped the organization prepare for their busiest season when they're transforming underutilized land into vibrant green spaces.



The Hero Smiles teams shared their time with five veterans' organizations:

- The team at **Fisher House** served a meal to veterans and their families.
- At **Project Journey**, the team helped to spruce up the outdoor communal space at a transitional home serving female veterans during times of emergency or need.
- At **Veterans Leadership Program of Western Pennsylvania**, the team prepared lunches for senior and disabled veterans.
- The team at **Soldiers & Sailors** helped to prepare for an upcoming book sale, proceeds of which helped to honor service men and women.
- The team at the **VA Hospital in Oakland** spent time visiting with patients, serving snacks and delivering care packages.

In November 2017, Eat'n Park Hospitality Group partnered with Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs to sponsor a 4-month-old service-dog-in-training. Once training is completed, the service dog will be matched with a veteran in need. Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs are trained to mitigate the effects of conditions such as PTSD, Traumatic Brain Injury, seizure disorders and mobility issues, and are donated to their recipients at no cost.

"We are honored to have amazing organizations like Eat'n Park join us in unleashing the power to heal through our individually trained service dogs," said Christine Patrick, Communications and Development Coordinator, Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs. "Since our establishment in 2010, we have raised, trained and paired more than 200 medical service dogs with deserving veterans and first-responders."

ENPHG team members submitted possible names for the Labrador/Pyrenees mix. The list was narrowed to three, and through social media platforms, the community was invited to vote for their favorite. Parker was the name that generated the most tail wags.

Eat'n Park's partnership with Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs is part of our Hero Smiles initiative, which focuses on enhancing the lives of military veterans and their families.





TEAM MEMBER FUNDRAISING AND PHILANTHROPY: KINDLING THE CARING GENE

There's an old, spiritual song whose lyrics say, "It only takes a spark to get a fire glowing." And ENPHG team members sparked a lot of glowing in 2017.

Our team members care about serving our guests, but they also care about giving back to their neighbors in need through the United Way. This past year our annual team-member campaign raised more than \$325,000.

That amazing total didn't stop the team from wanting to do more. One of our more visible team-member-driven campaigns is the Caring for Kids campaign. The campaign raises funds to support free care services in pediatric hospitals and programs in the communities where Eat'n Park Hospitality Group has a presence. The 2017 campaign raised more than \$400,000. Since we introduced Caring for Kids in 1979, the campaign has raised more than \$10.7 million, a total that is possible only through the generosity of our team members, guests and partners.

If you saw a glow around your nearest Hello Bistro location that's because of Give Some Green. With this newer philanthropic initiative, when Hello Bistro guests order a menu item designated as #GiveSomeGreen, ENPHG donates the funds that equate to one pound of produce to the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank. Through the Food Bank's Produce to People program, families can receive 30-45 pounds of food, which includes mostly fresh produce. In 2017, we contributed 16,366 pounds of produce. Talk about sparking a movement!





TAKING SMILES TO THE STREET: COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

It Begins with a Smile

Part rock star, part icon, Smiley gets around. And everywhere he goes, the smiles spread like wildfire.

In 2017, our sweet friend brought passion to the community in the following ways:

- 17,183 dozen Smiley Cookies were donated through the Community Partnerships Department at Eat'n Park Hospitality Group.
- At Cookie Cruiser events, 4,969 dozen Smiley Cookies were shared.
- Kids — and their adults — enjoyed 34 hosted Cookie Cruiser events.
- The big softy excited lots of folks at 95 Smiley events.

It Continues with Activity

Smiley isn't alone in bringing happiness to the community. ENPHG also has an active Youth Sports Program. In 2017, ENPHG invested more than \$150,000 in sponsoring hundreds of youth sports teams in the communities where we live and work. In fact, every Eat'n Park Restaurant sponsors at least one team in their neighborhood.

At our core, ENPHG is defined by providing high quality food. For some members of our community, accessing healthy foods can be a challenge. We are helping to eliminate barriers to healthy foods by financially supporting food banks. And we do so in every community where we have a presence.

A spirit of generosity can launch endless smiles, and our team members' purpose is to create smiles. One of their favorite past times is volunteering for the organizations and causes that mean the most to them.

As a company, ENPHG is honored to support our team members' passion for caring. We hosted more than 15 team volunteer opportunities throughout 2017. We'd like to share the story of our 2017 Volunteer of the Year, Bill Emerick, from our Altoona Eat'n Park Restaurant. His selflessness ignites a passion in all of us.



Bill Emerick: 2017 Volunteer of the Year

Despite being technically retired, Bill is very dedicated to his work at his restaurant — he cares about the quality of his work and is highly respected by his coworkers. His background in the food industry and his servant spirit equip him perfectly for volunteer work at his church and at the Joshua House.

Bill has been volunteering at his church, Westside United Methodist, for five years. He started as a trustee chairman and served as the church's handyman. After a while, he wanted to dig in even more. He began serving meals to more than 100 people every Monday evening and something clicked — Bill loves people and he loves to cook, so what a fitting way to use his talents and interests for good.

A couple years later, Bill was led to volunteer at the Joshua House, where he could also put to use his special skill set. The Joshua House's mission is to help youth find purpose. To this end, Bill helps to coordinate and serve food at a number of annual events: three wellness races each year; Hoopsfest (a 1,000-player basketball tournament); a Thanksgiving dinner that provides more than 350 meals; Operation Christmas Blessing, which supplements all the traditional elements of Christmas for 30 families in need; and an afterschool homework club, where Bill provides hot meals for kids three times a week.

We're proud of Bill's efforts and proud to call him our 2017 Volunteer of the Year! In celebration, Eat'n Park Hospitality Group made a \$1,500 donation to the Joshua House in Bill's honor.
